4.4	Does the University provide bridge/remedial courses to the educationally disadvantaged students? If yes, please give details	Yes. The university provides remedial classes to the educationally weaker students to uplift, sharpen their knowledge, skill development and to enhance their capacity. The students are given extra mentoring by the concerned subject faculty to improve their academic performance. There is a provision to conduct remedial classes on Saturday and the same has been approved in 30 th Academic council. The Dean of the respective schools engaged the concerned faculty members to conduct the Remedial classes on each Saturday by following the appropriate time-table. In Pharmacy courses students from biology background finds it difficult to clear in the compulsory maths subject and vice versa. Also, there are many students who come from hindi medium background at school level. To mitigate the above-mentioned problems the university runs English language proficiency
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		programme as well as remedial classes of weaker students are conducted at semester end. 30 th Academic council approved the conduct of remedial classes. The approval is attached in Annexure IV

Through combination of the above Please also provide details about the weightage give to the above	The admissions to various academic programmes offered are open to all eligible students who fulfil the admission criteria laid down by the University. The eligibility criteria and admission process are publicized through the following media: (a) Admission Prospectus – The Prospectus published gives information about the programmes offered, eligibility criteria, admission process, fee structure, infrastructure facilities, and rules and regulations. (b) University Website – The University has its own website: www.iecuniversity.com. Admission
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process and relevant information are available on the university website.

(c) Advertisement in Print & Electronic Media - In order to disseminate information about admissions extensive advertisements are floated through leading National Newspapers and social media.

(d) Hoardings and Participation in Educational Fairs are also used for admission information.

Selection Process

The admission to all the programmes are made on the basis of score in qualifying examination. To be specific, the eligibility criteria for different programmes is as under:

1. School of Engineering: Admission is allowed in B.Tech. Programme based on PCM/PCB score (Min.40-45%). The admission priority is given to students with JEE score and minimum score of 45-

2. School of Law. Admissions to BA.LLB 5 Year Programme are made as per the guidelines of Bar Council of India. The merit is determined on the basis of marks in qualifying examination (Min. 40-45%). LLM admissions are based on merit in qualifying examination and minimum score of 45-50% in UG.

3. School of Commerce and Management: Admissions to UG Programme are made on merit (Min.40-45%). Admissions to MBA are given on the basis of Entrance Test score of MAT/CAT and minimum score of 45-50% in UG.

School of Humanities and Social Sciences: Admissions to UG Programme are made on merit (Min.40-45%). For PG programme minimum score of 45-50% in UG required for admission.

5. School of Pharmacy and Allied Health Sciences: Admissions to UG Programme are made on merit (Min.40-45%). For PG programme minimum score of 45-50% in UG required for admission. For Diploma programme passing marks in 10+2 required for admission.

School of Basic and Applied Sciences. Admissions to UG Programme are made on merit (Min.40-45%). For PG programme minimum score of 45-50% in UG required for admission. Thus, merit in qualifying examination, entrance test and interview are the basic criteria for admission in all programmes. Minimum eligibility of 40-45% marks in qualifying examination is generally followed for admission in the University. Admissions to Ph.D. Programmes are made on the basis of Entrance Test followed by interview-cumpresentation on the proposed research topic. The UGC guidelines are followed for admission to Ph.D. Programme. (Annexure XI)

ADMISSION PROCEDURE:

Please note that the office of International Affairs, IEC University which handles the admission of foreign students for all programs offered by the university, works predominantly through email. The applicants are also encouraged and advised to use the electronic media most effectively. Fill up the application carefully without missing any detail. If the marks are not known or not available at the time of filling the application, please indicate "Results are awaited" in the marks/grade column. Candidates whose results are generally released not earlier than June may send the forecast / predicted / term results duly endorsed by the head of their school. The candidate is expected to send the marks to the university as soon as it is available to ascertain the eligibility. It is to be noted that the application will be considered only if the marks are made available to the university within the stipulated date

ELIGIBILITY

- 10th and 12th / Bachelor Degree certificate along with marks sheet/transcript. Both front and back sides of the mark sheet are to be copied and sent in order to get additional information about the grade equivalence, passing requirements etc.
- If the content in the marks sheet is not in English, then the certified English translated version must also be submitted in addition to the native language certificate.
- In case the results have not been released, then the predicted marks/grades or the term result of the qualifying examination must be submitted.
- Copy of the passport of the applicant.
- Soft copy of the latest Passport size colour photograph
- English language requirement: IELTS (academic)= 6.0 OR TOEFL(IBT) = 60-78/TOEFL (paper) = 513-547

SELECTION AND ENROLLMENT

Enrolment is the process of verifying the original certificates, obtaining declarations from the parents/student, and issuing the Admit Card, on arrival to the campus. The university will send a separate communication detailing the procedure

for commencement of classes and other information necessary for completing the admission formalities. The candidates are advised to look at the website for the actual date of commencement of first year classes. Registration Students are advised to reach IEC University at least 2-3 days prior to the commencement of classes and report to the Office of the International Affairs to complete the above admission formalities.
